The State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World 2017

This year's report is published by an expanded partnership, with UNICEF and WHO joining FAO, IFAD and WFP for the first time. Using both the traditional measure of the prevalence of undernourishment and a new indicator, the prevalence of severe food insecurity, it marks a new era in the monitoring of food security and nutrition in the context of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the UN Decade of Action on Nutrition. The report warns that the long-term declining trend in undernourishment seems to have come to a halt and may have reversed, largely on account of the above-mentioned factors. Meanwhile, though progress continues to be made in reducing child malnutrition, rising overweight and obesity are a concern in most parts of the world. 


